A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

We Should Have Fire In Our Hearts

On the day of our Baptism, we received the light of Christ and were instructed to keep that torch burning brightly until the return of Christ Jesus. Further, the Holy Spirit was sent into our hearts at Confirmation to help set us on fire. The old proverb should be applicable to all baptized and confirmed Christians: "One who is on fire cannot sit on a chair."

Our Lord Jesus continues to cast fire on the earth, the fire of the Spirit, through the ministry of Word and Sacraments. As Christians, we should have fire to inflame people to care, to serve, and to bless each other with all the gifts of Faith. We should work with the Holy Spirit to allow that fire to burn off the impurities in us and to bring out the purity of the gold and silver within us. We need divine fire to inflame our hearts with the love of God and love for His children. We Christians should blaze with the same fire with which Jesus wished His disciples to burn: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" Hence, let us remember the old saying, "One who is on fire cannot sit on a chair," and let us carry the fire of the Holy Spirit wherever we go.

We have begun the work at St. Gaspar church. Thanks to everyone reaching out to help in whatever way possible.

Becoming Catholic (RCIA)

A story in the New Testament tells about the conversion of Paul, who lived in the Holy Land at the time of Jesus. Then known as Saul, he was feared as a man who zealously persecuted Christians.

One day, as Saul was hunting down Christians, a blinding light knocked him to the ground, and a voice asked, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?"

Following this unusual experience, Saul became Paul, and he became Christianity's most effective apostle to the Greek and Roman world. Our own journeys of faith, though not usually as dramatic as Paul's, can lead us over rocky roads with some unusual twists and turns. We may discover Christ in the most unexpected places, at unexpected times and in the most unlikely people. Our experience of God is shaped by our experience of life.

The RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is our parish community's welcoming outreach to anyone whose faith journey has caused them to investigate the beliefs of the Catholic Church. We welcome anyone who might wish to join us.

RCIA is designed for:

- Non-baptized adults seeking membership in the Catholic Church,
- Adults baptized in other Christian communities who would like to be part of the Catholic Church,
- Adults baptized as Catholics, but who have not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation.

The Woman – In the Gospels, we hear Jesus refer to His mother, Mary as "Woman." This reference should draw our attention to both Genesis and Revelation. But who is



JESUS WOULD RATHER A FAMILY BE DIVIDED THAN CORRUPTED

We like to visualize the Holy Spirit coming as a dove, a symbol of peace. But at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles as tongues of fire. Fire has a much different connotation, suggesting danger and destruction. This is the image Jesus uses in today's Gospel. He has begun His journey to Jerusalem, so heavy on His mind is the knowledge that He will face people with evil in their hearts, people who are willing to put that evil into action. Like Jeremiah, Jesus has angered the political and religious authorities. At this point, peace is not His goal. First, the evil in people's hearts must be destroyed. When ignored, evil can flourish, spreading among those willing to look the other way, infecting an entire household or a whole community. The Holy Spirit, who comes to us in Baptism, gives us the wisdom and fortitude to confront evil and the purifying fire to cauterize it before it spreads. May our Lord inspire us to do so, for "he endured such opposition from sinners, in order that (we) may not grow weary and lose heart."

When have you felt prompted to stand up to evil? When have you done so and when have you failed to do so?
