“Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. ...I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. ...now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God.”

These are the words of John the Baptist proclaiming to the world and to us who Jesus is. We have moved on from the Christmas season and into what the Church calls “ordinary time.” However, if we believe John’s words to be true, then we must understand “ordinary” does not mean unimportant! For us as Catholics, Ordinary Time is the time we focus on Jesus’ life of public ministry. It is an opportunity to learn from His teachings and especially to listen for and discern His call to discipleship. A discipleship that will challenge you, surprise you, exhilarate you and humble you. There is nothing “ordinary” about living a life of discipleship in Jesus Christ. There is no room to “ride the fence” and remain undecided. That is why Scripture is so very clear on the identity of Jesus, so we can make no mistake in deciding which side we’re on.

Following Christmas Day, the Church immediately gives us the feasts of the Holy Family, the Epiphany and The Baptism of the Lord, to make very sure we understand that the humble baby born in Bethlehem is anything but “ordinary.” The Baby Jesus inspired the rage and jealousy of kings and the love and worship of Wise Men; and this happens even now in our day. The spiritual battle that rages is as old as creation and the Lord asks us, as His church, to help fight for as many souls as we can for Him. He has told us who He is and gives us, through the sacraments, the grace we need to fight the battle.

It’s never too late to make a resolution. Resolve to grow in your faith this year. Be intentional about it. Create new habits in 2026, putting God first and foremost in your life. Pray and meditate on what it means for you to be Christ’s disciple and what changes God is calling you to make in becoming the best disciple you can be.

they are looking at *The Martyrdom of St. Agnes* as depicted by Zampieri Domenico.




The Story of Saint Francis de Sales




